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

Additionally, use your College Board account for other scholarship opportunities, utilizing the BigFuture link at www.collegeboard.com, which is full of additional college planning features.

Enrico Fermi Educational Fund of Yonkers



Entering our 61st year, The Enrico Fermi Educational Fund of Yonkers, Inc. ("Enrico Fermi") is proud to announce our Sixty First (61st) year of providing College scholarships for High School Seniors with traceable Italian heritage who are graduating from an accredited High School. The applicant must be a resident of Yonkers or Westchester County, regardless of the location of the high school they attend. The Science Scholarship is open to all Westchester County residents.

Each student applicant will be evaluated based upon their excellent scholastic results, evidence of involvement and leadership, service to the school and community, outstanding character, evidence of Italian heritage, residency requirement and meet the criteria as further described below. The Scholarship process is highly competitive with recipients selected by a Selection Committee composed of Trustees, Educators and Members.

Applications can be found and completed online through our website at www.enricofermi.org Note that for purposes of residence, the legal residence is based on an actual physical address, not a postal zip code address.

- Yonkers Scholarships This Scholarship is open to residents of The City of Yonkers, NY
 (only) who are of traceable Italian heritage, graduating from an accredited public or private
 high school, upon graduation plan on attending a college or university. There will be four (4)
 scholarships of, at least, \$5,000 each.
- Science Scholarship This Scholarship is open to legal residents of Westchester (including Yonkers). The applicant must have the endorsement of the high school to apply for this scholarship (only one per school). The Applicant must be of traceable Italian heritage, a resident of Westchester County NY, graduating from an accredited public or private high school who, upon graduation, plans on attending a college or university. It is expected that applicants would be engaged in some form of scientific research, have taken or are currently excelling in AP science courses, and are interested in pursuing a career in a STEM field. There will be One Scholarship of \$5,000.

Scholarship Eligibility Criteria: The Enrico Fermi Educational Fund of Yonkers, Inc. offers Academic based scholarships to graduating seniors from an accredited public or private high school. Each student will be evaluated based upon his or her exceptional scholastic / academics, evidence of leadership and involvement, service to the school and the community through community activities, outstanding character, and evidence of traceable Italian heritage. Now in our Sixty First (61st) year of awarding scholarships to deserving high school seniors of Yonkers and more recently Westchester County, New York., we recognize that these scholarships are very competitive, considering the superior academic, leadership, extracurricular, community service and other qualities exhibited by applicants and, ultimately, the recipients.

In order to be considered, an applicant must:

- Be a member of the graduating class in the year of the application and graduate from an accredited public or private high school with the graduating class
- Be of traceable Italian heritage
- Be a resident of the City of Yonkers for the Yonkers Scholarship, and of Westchester County for the Westchester County and Science Scholarships. Residency is based on the actual physical legal address, not the post office zip code.
- Have applied or in the process of applying to a recognized and accredited College
- File a completed application on or before the Closing Date of our online application process, which, starting on January 4, 2024, can be found through our website at www.enricofermi.org.
 Note that the application process closes on March 10, 2024.

The completed online scholarship application must include (note that incomplete applications will be ineligible for consideration):

- An official school transcript. The transcript must include 12th grade mid-year grades, 3 year average, class rank (if available), and test scores (SAT and/or ACT scores, if available)
- A complete listing of extracurricular activities/awards
- A complete listing of service to the community
- At least two letters of recommendation from the school's professional staff
- Various essays of at least 250 words each addressing the topic of how your Italian heritage
 has influenced your life and goals, as well as on community service, extracurricular activities
 and other topics
- A certification and acknowledgement form, which is part of the online application.

Important dates:

Following are the important dates in the 2024 Scholarship process

- January 5, 2024 Online Application Process begins
- February 28, 2024 (no later than) School submits in name of Science sponsored Applicant, one per school, if any
- March 10, 2024. Application deadline. Note that the online application process will be "shut down" and unavailable after March 10, 2024. As such, all applications must be received by 11:59 pm on this date.
- April 10, 2024 (on or about) Students Recipients notified.
- April 28, 2024 Sixty First (61st) Annual Enrico Fermi Scholarship Breakfast and Recognition Ceremony to be held at Mulino's at Lake Isle. All recipients are required to attend.

Note that, once awarded, payment of the scholarships will be made to each recipient when actual attendance at the College of his/her choice is verified in writing and will be paid in installments ranging from two to four years.

A graduating student from any one of the Yonkers public high schools. Student must be a Yonkers resident. A student known to his fellow peers, teachers, administrators for their advocacy to make a positive difference in their school and community.

Scholarship is awarded to ONE (1) graduating high school senior enrolled in the Yonkers Public School (YPS).

Required

- A Yonkers Public School High School Senior
- Anticipate graduation at the time of application submission. Must submit an official transcript for verification.
- Show proof of how they contributed to help bring awareness to "Bullying" and influenced DEI & "Kindness" in their school (i.e., created a club, held a position in a club, created awareness through events, flyers, school article, presentations etc.)

Optional but highly recommended to submit:

- Have a high school G.P.A. of 3.0 or higher
- Show proof of acceptance to a regionally accredited post-secondary institution Show how you consistently advocated & brought awareness to HAN4D's mission throughout the 4 years of high school.

Stability of character and responsible citizenship are to be of primary importance.

SCHOOL OR COLLEGE:

Applicants for the HAN4D Scholarship should be planning to attend an accredited 2- or 4-year institution.

AMOUNT OF AWARD:

\$250.00 (non-recurring/non-renewable)

BASIS OF AWARD:

ADDRESS BY DR. PAUL M. MITCHELL, SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS TO THE YONKERS PTA COUNCIL OCTOBER 23, 1968 AT ROOSEVELT HIGH SCHOOL

In addition to courage and wisdom in innovation, a school district must also have a source of stability and vitality, a source that can be used as a yardstick to measure its educational progress. I believe these ideas, beliefs, and traditions which are interwoven in the American Creed constitute that source. The Creed is still a core of commonly accepted working principles, not absolute and subject to different interpretations, but has enough uniformity of meaning to be used as the moral basis of social justice and as a guide to social direction. I believe this uniformity of meaning would be found in the following beliefs:

A belief that all human beings are of supreme and equal moral worth;

A belief that human beings should be the architects of their destiny;

A belief that the state is a creation of the people and subservient to them;

A belief that human intelligence can build a better world;

A belief in the rule of self-imposed written law;

A belief in the rule of the majority with the protection of the minority;

A belief in the rights of peaceful social change;

A belief in the right of the individual to be free in all respects not harmful to the common good;

A belief in the rights of the individual to expect reasonable economic security.

In a time of which it is said that no man who is born today will die in the same world into which he was born, these beliefs can make it possible for a man to stand with his feet anchored in unshakable convictions; to breathe in an atomic atmosphere laden with change and with portends of greater change yet to come, and to reach into the unknown. He will be able to reach with the confidence that he can mold from the chaos of value conflicts a foundation, even different from his own if need be, but one upon which his sons may stand with the confidence and understanding necessary to go forward.



UNDERSTANDING COLLEGE COSTS

Paying the college bills has become an expressive proposition for American student and their families. Like most items that we purchase in America, college costs have risen consistently. Today, four years at a private college can average between \$100,000 and \$175,000. The cost of four years at a public institution ranges from \$40,000 to \$75,000 for resident students. Out-of-State students will sometimes pay more. At the high end of the scale, a small number of private colleges currently cost \$44,000 or more per year. Public colleges at the other end of the scale may cost as little as \$12,000 annually.

At the same time, more students are competing for the financial assistance made available by the government, institutions, and private sources to students each year in pos-secondary education.

All of these conditions warrant students' and their families' understanding of just what they are paying for and exercising control when options exist. College costs fall into categories: fixed and controllable.

FIXED COSTS – These costs are the same for all students, they include:

- Tuition
- Room and Board
- Student Fees

Tuition is the cost of your education and is set by the institution or by the governing authority overseeing the institution or system of higher education.

Room and Board costs are fixed if the student is required to live on campus, a situation that is often the case for first-year students.

Student Fees range from the activities fee (providing access to athletic and cultural events) to library fees.

Note: Several colleges have experimented with fixed or limited increase tuition plans. In these situations, students entering college at a particular point will know the cost of tuition and the adjustment they can expect to see during their total enrollment period.

CONTROLLABLE COSTS – These are the costs for which the student can exercise some degree of spending authority. They include:

- Books and Materials
- Personal Expenses
- Transportation
- Room and Board (on-campus versus off-campus)

Book Costs can be controlled somewhat by the acquisition of used books.

Personal Expenses such as entertainment, clothing, and toiletries are influenced by preference, need, and consumption rates. Think about the items (e.g., shampoo, snacks, stamps) you need and consume today. When you get to college, the cost of these things will come out of your expenses budget.

Transportation between the students' home and the campus and other travel costs are affected by the method of transportation that one uses to get back and forth and how often the students travel.

Room and Board costs can be controlled when the students reside off-campus or have variable campus meal plans available.

Given the range of expenses and the limited ability that students have to exercise control, costs, aid opportunities, and positions must be fully examined and understood. Costs should never be used as the factor or criterion that guides exploration, and no college should ever be excluded from consideration due to cost until the student knows what type of financial assistance package might be assembled by the financial aid office.

Understanding college costs is only half of the information that students and their families must possess. You must also understand the college students' financial aid system and the various available forms of assistance. It is information you won't regret searching for.

FINANCIAL AID

TYPES AND SOURCES

Education after high school is a major investment for the family and financing of higher education today has become a major challenge. Part of that challenge is to learn how the financial aid system works and the degree to which the various forms of student financial aid will offset the rising costs.

The financial aid system in America's higher education operates according to the following basic principle: students and their families contribute to the cost of college. The difference between their ability to contribute and the cost of going to college is referred to as "need".

STUDENT/FAMILY CONTRIBUTIONS = FINANCIAL AID ELIGIBILITY

Since much of the students' assistance in this nation comes from federal sources, guidelines established by Congress and administered by the U.S. Department of Education provide the structure for many of the other students' financial; aid programs and policies.

To qualify for federal assistance and much of the aid offered by related sources, students must demonstrate need. At its simplest level, a student's financial need is the difference between the cost of attendance and the amount the family can be expected to contribute to the student's education.

Even though college costs may vary, the family contribution remains constant. The student's financial aid eligibility increases as the cost increases, one important reason that the students should not exclude colleges from consideration simply based on cost.

THREE BASIC TYPES OF FEDERAL FINANCIAL AID

GRANTS are gift aid and do not have to be repaid. The amount of the federal grant will vary from year to year, depending on the funds that have been appropriated for the grant programs. **WORK-STUDY** is student assistance in the form of employment at your college. This part-time employment provides an opportunity for you to earn money (at least at current federal minimum wage levels) to offset the cost of your schooling.

LOANS enable students and parents to borrow funds to meet educational costs. These loans must be repaid-with interest. Beyond the federal aid programs, students find financial aid available from New York State, private sources, and colleges themselves. New York State requires demonstrated need and residency but may have other eligibility criteria as well.

PRIVATE SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAMS are offered by school districts, corporations, private donors, public service and fraternal organizations, foundations, labor unions, and other groups. These are both merit and need-based. Once you have narrowed the list of colleges to a reasonable number, inquire about the availability of scholarships and grants from those institutions utilizing resources such as this book and/or using the websites provided. This requires you to invest some time searching online. High-cost colleges

Students and families need to be aware of the terms under which aid is offered and any requirements (e.g. maintenance of a specific grade point average) for its continuance. The perception that only the needlest of families qualify for financial assistance often results in many students not even applying for aid. All families should examine the various sources of aid and determine the extent to which they can and should participate.

School counselors can provide general information about sources and types of financial assistance and often know about special scholarships and awards that are unique to the school, community, or region. College financial aid officers are experts in the federal, state, and institution programs and can provide details about the lending opportunities and terms offered at commercial banks. Financial aid websites such as www.fafsa.ed.gov and www.fastweb.com are excellent sources of information.

MAKING THE FINANCIAL AID FORMS WORK FOR YOU

If completing the collection of college admissions forms you have assembled was not enough, you will soon discover that <u>financial aid applications will require equal time and attention</u>. If applying for financial assistance you will need to file original forms and update or re-file them each year you wish to remain an aid recipient.

The process begins by making certain that you have the right forms. Some will be available from www.fafsa.ed.gov or the Guidance office. Others will come directly from the college, agency firm, or organization making the award. Other forms, such as loan applications, must be obtained from the banks or lending institutions. It is a good idea to ask for financial aid forms at the time you are gathering your admissions applications.

Once assembled, it is always a good idea to review all of the forms to determine what information you will need to respond to the questions. Since financial aid is often based on need, many of the questions will address family financial matters. Your parents need to be involved in their completion and must attest to their accuracy. To be considered for the Federal Student Aid Programs (e.g. Federal Pell Grants and Federal Family Education Loans) a student must complete the **Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA).** This application collects financial; aid and other information used to calculate the Expected Family Contribution (EFC) that ultimately determines the student's eligibility for aid.

Since eligibility for the federal programs serves as the basis for other financial aid programs, the FAFSA is the first and, in many cases, the only, financial aid form the students will complete. The information that accompanies the FAFSA will direct the applicant regarding the application processing cycle.

Approximately four weeks after submitting the FAFSA, you will receive a Student Aid Report (SAR). The SAR contains information that you provided on the FAFSA, plus your (EFC) Expected Family Contribution. This is the figure the college will use in determining your eligibility for federal student aid. It is your responsibility to check the SAR and make sure that everything is correct. Also, be certain that your current address is always on file with the United States Department of Education.

If you are an applicant for institutional aid, you may be required to complete the CSS Financial Aid PROFILE or a college-specific financial aid application. These forms will request information beyond that on the FAFSA, information that the colleges feel is important in their assessment of need.

The college financial aid officer can tell you what forms will be required to apply for institutional aid and offer any guidance you may need in their completion.

For help with the FAFSA contact Federal Student Aid Information Center or check with your YPIE School Representative. Call toll free 1-800-FED-AID (1-800-433-3243) for federal student aid information, or visit the site at www.fafsa.ed.gov

In addition to the FAFSA, CSS Financial Aid PROFILE, and college-specific forms, you will need several other items when you and your parents sit down to complete this important task. These include:

- Your most recent tax return
- Your parents' most recent tax return, and
- Other records such as W-2 forms, statements, business/farm records, and investment records.

During the process of completing the various forms, make certain that you answer all of the relevant questions with the most current and accurate information. Sign each form (some require both student and parent signatures) and send them to the appropriate processing agency or office (make sure you make copies for yourself). Be sensitive to deadlines as many scholarships, grants, and institutional awards have application periods by cycles or award the assistance on a first-come, first-served basis.

WHEN YOU APPLY TO COLLEGES AND UNIVERSITIES YOU HAVE RESPONSIBILITIES Before You Apply:

- You have the responsibility to research and understand the policies and procedures of each college or university regarding application fees, financial aid, scholarships, and housing. You should also be sure that you understand the policies of each school regarding deposits that you may be required to make before you enroll.
- Be sure to forward your proof of enrollment to the District Guidance Department as soon as you
 receive it, IF, you are a scholarship recipient of a local of the YPS Scholarship Handbook
 Scholarships.

<u>Funds will not be released to the college or university of your choice if paperwork is not received.</u>

As You Apply:

- You must complete all materials that are required for application, and submit your application on or before the published deadlines. You should be the sole author of your applications.
- You should seek the assistance of your school counselor early and throughout the application period. Follow the process recommended by your high school for filing college applications.
- It is your responsibility to arrange, if appropriate, for visits to and/or interviews at colleges of your choice.

After You Receive Your Admission Decision:

- You must notify each college or university which accepts you whether you are accepting or rejecting the offer. You should make these notifications as soon as you have made a final decision as to the college that you wish to attend, but no later than May 1st. It is understood that May 1st will be the postmarked date.
- You may confirm your intention to enroll and, if required, submit a deposit to only one college or university. The exception to this arises if you are put on a waitlist by a college or university and are later admitted to that institution. You may accept the offer and send a deposit. However, you must immediately notify a college or university at which you previously indicated your intention to enroll.
- If you are accepted under an early decision plan, you must promptly withdraw the applications submitted to other colleges and universities and make no additional applications. (If you are an early decision candidate and are seeking financial aid, you need not withdraw other applications until you have received notification about financial aid.)

 If you think that your rights have been denied, you should contact the college or university immediately to request additional information or the extension of a reply date. In addition, you should ask your counselor to notify the president of the state or regional affiliate of the National Association for College Admission Counseling. If you need further assistance, send a copy of any correspondence you have had with the college or university and a copy of your letter of admission to NACAC N Highland Street, Suite 400, Arlington, VA 22201, info@nacacnet.org

WHAT TO EXPECT AFTER THE APPLICATION

When the application for admission has been reviewed by a college, one of the following actions can result. If you have explored properly and applied to colleges where the students reflect the academic characteristics and personal qualities that you present, there is a strong likelihood that an acceptance letter will find its way to your mailbox.

If an application is not accepted, there are four other outcomes. Let's look at each:

CONDITIONAL ADMISSION- A conditional admission means that your admissions are dependent upon your meeting some special or additional requirements (e.g. summer study, mid-year enrollment). Contact the college admissions office directly to make certain you understand the terms of the admission and your timeline for meeting these requirements.

DEFERRED- Early decision/Early action candidates are placed in a regular decision pool.

WAIT-LISTED -If you are wait-listed, you have the right to know the wait-list history of the institution. In other words, how many people are typically moved from the list to general admission? If you can review this information for the previously entering class or two, you will get some sense of your status and whether or not you should hold out hope of enrollment. If your applications result in a combination of acceptances and wait-list responses, you will need to consider the result in a combination of acceptances and wait-list responses, you will need to consider these variables like the date approaches for responding to your offers of admission. Again, it is wise to consult with the admission officers and your counselor for interpretation and guidance.

APPLICATION DENIED- Some students who are denied admission take it upon themselves to appeal the decision, especially if they feel that the decision did not take all the appropriate factors into account. While certainly a long shot, this avenue is open to you and should be taken if there is any indication that the college acted without full information.

If all of your applications are rejected, you should contact your counselor immediately and map out an alternate course of action. There may be appropriate colleges that are still taking applications, even at this late point in the admission cycle. If you need to strengthen your academic status, you might wish to enroll in a junior or community college or engage in additional preparatory studies and reapply as a transfer applicant.

A student receiving acceptance letters should be prepared to inform the one college that he/she wishes to attend by May 1, the date viewed by the collegiate community as the universal reply date. Along with your letter of notification, you may be asked to send an admission or housing deposit to confirm your enrollment intentions.

<u>Under no circumstances should you declare your intention to enroll at more than one college.</u>

If you are faced with the situation in which you have been accepted to more than one college, you must once again weigh the criteria that you studied in making your application decisions and determine which one of these colleges will present you with the best learning and living situation. When the academic and social scales are even, it may boil down to cost or the financial aid offer, but avoid using these criteria as your primary guide. After notifying the college/university know you are accepting their offer of admission, let the others that tendered you an acceptance know about that decision.

Keep your academic work up throughout the remainder of your senior year and begin making plans to be a college freshman. Congratulations. The exploration, decision-making plans, and application journey are now complete. Exciting times await you at the college you have selected!
